Thank you for taking the time to publish *The Secret Life of Judges*. Your words are refreshing, especially page 2861, paragraph 4, "I sometimes think that the problem at bottom is really a lack of respect by lawyers for other people."

Recently I cited *The Secret Life of Judges* in a supplemental brief to the Supreme Court of the United States, copy enclosed. Unfortunately my pro se Petition No. 12-7747 for writ of certiorari was denied February 19, 2013, but I plan to submit a petition for rehearing.

Should you revisit this topic in another writing, consider what is happening at The Florida Bar, and perhaps other state regulatory bars in America. The "ambient bias" is disrupted in a way that suggests infringement on the U.S. Const. art. I, § 10, clause 1, contracts, "No State shall...grant any Title of Nobility" [Esquire]. When Florida grants a license to practice law, it is essentially granting a title of nobility, Esquire, one that trumps the both the state and federal judiciary.
